SEA-DOO WATERCRAFT RACERS CAPTURE SEVEN CHAMPIONSHIPS AT APBA NATIONALS

**Racer Eric Lagopoulos claims \$1,225.00
aboard new Sea-Doo RXP-X watercraft in
special Sea-Doo XX Bounty Challenge**

Nashville, TN September 11, 2007 — Sea-Doo® watercraft mounted racers captured seven titles at the United States premier watercraft racing championship, including the premier Pro-Am Runabout Open and Pro-Am Runabout Stock classes. Hundreds of watercraft racers from across North America converged onto Percy Priest Lake in Nashville, TN in attempts to leave as a 2007 APBA watercross racing champion. A special event for the top Sea-Doo racers of the 2007 season was also a highlight of the weekend's festivities.

Justin Haverkate from Michigan rode a race that will be remembered for many years aboard his Sea-Doo watercraft on his way to the premier Pro-Am Runabout Open title. In a 15-lap battle that saw the top five racers with-in four seconds of one another, Haverkate worked his way from a mid-pack start, methodically picking up positions lap after lap. On lap 11 he gained the inside position on the leader racing down the front straight-away gaining the lead he would stretch into an eventual 17 second win.



Allen Walker, a veteran Sea-Doo watercraft racer from Homestead, FL, earned his first national title in the hotly contested Pro-Am Runabout stock class. Walker's flawless moto wins earned him a place in history as the 2007 champion. Eric Lagopoulos added yet another Pro-Am

Runabout 800 title to his resume with a convincing performance on his Sea-Doo watercraft.

Select Sea-Doo racers were invited to compete in a special Sea-Doo Bounty competition aboard the new 255 hp Sea-Doo RXP-X™ watercraft for a \$1225 top prize. The Sea-Doo Bounty is a BRP supported racer contingency program that rewards Sea-Doo mounted racers with cash prizes for successfully competing in specified classes at regional and national races. The top ten Sea-Doo Bounty money earners were invited to compete in the special Sea-Doo XX Bounty Challenge and a chance to take home the weekends biggest prize purse, \$1,255.00.

Ten riders were given one lap on the course aboard the new Sea-Doo RXP-X watercraft to post their fastest time with the top two times advancing to a final on Sunday. The top qualifiers were two Floridians, Tim Ducat and Lagopoulos. Ducat posted the fast time of the day with a 53.08 followed by Lagopoulos with a 53.90 - times comparable to those run by the highly-modified Pro-Am Open machines.

The Sunday final saw each racer put in his two best laps in front of a packed beach between final motos. Veteran Lagopoulos was first on the track with the Sea-Doo RXP-X and ran a flawless two laps posting a 1:43 putting all the pressure on Ducat to best his time. Ducat ran fast but a few minor errors posted a second place time of 1:47. With the fastest time Lagopoulos collected the \$1,225.00 Sea-Doo XX Bounty relegating Ducat to the \$255 second place prize.



The Sea-Doo XX Bounty Challenge will be repeated at the IJSBA World Finals in Lake Havasu City, AZ in early October with a bigger prize purse. Select Sea-Doo mounted racers will be invited to compete as the Sea-Doo Bounty program is designed to reward and thank those watercraft racers who choose Sea-Doo as their race machine of choice.
